NOW ACCEPTING FCSS GRANT APPLICATIONS

Family & Community Support Services (FCSS) is:

"FCSS is a unique 80/20 funding partnership between the Government of Alberta and participating municipalities or Metis settlements. Provincially, the FCSS Program receives its mandate from the FCSS Act and Regulation. The Act describes what the province and municipality/Metis Settlement can do to provide preventive social services. The Regulation describes how services may be provided ... Under FCSS, communities design and deliver social programs that are preventive in nature to promote and enhance well-being among individuals, families and communities ..."

What are the eligible projects for FCSS funding?

Services provided under the program must:

- Be of preventive nature that enhances the social well-being of individuals and families through promotion or intervention strategies provided at the earliest opportunity;
- 2. Do one or more of the following:
 - a. Help people to develop independence, strengthen coping skills and become more resistant to crisis;
 - b. Help people to develop an awareness of social needs;
 - c. Help people to develop interpersonal and group skills which enhance constructive relationships among people;
 - d. Help people and communities to assume responsibility for decisions and actions which affect them;
 - e. Provide supports that help sustain people as active participants in the community.

Alberta Emergency Preparedness Week – May 7 to 13, 2023

Albertans are encouraged to practice their own emergency preparation, as disasters can occur with little to no warning. Here are a few tips on how to be prepared:

- Sign up to receive Alberta emergency alerts
- Build and maintain emergency kits.
- Have an emergency plan in place and practice that plan with your family.
- Review your insurance coverage with your provider to ensure that you have sufficient coverage to protect your family and property.

Kits should include provisions for a minimum of 72 hours – Some ideas are below Food-canned goods like beans, soup and pasta, snacks (granola, energy bars, dried fruit or trail mix) Water and liquids (4 litres, per person, per day) Minimum 72 hour supply of water and electrolytes Adequate supply of any prescription drugs, such as heart medication, insulin for people with diabetes and inhalers for people with asthma; over-the-counter medications such as pain relievers, cold medications, digestive aids and anti-nausea; first aid kit; vitamins Essential medical equipment with backup power Personal hygiene products Back-up pair of glasses and/or extra contact lenses and solution Have a copy of all personal documents including an emergency contact list in a protective, sealable bag Other items - enough emergency cash to cover up to 2 weeks of incidental expenses, if possible Battery-powered or crank radio and flashlight, candles and matches or a lighter Space heaters and extra blankets Essential tools like a can opener or a multi-tool Extra batteries for household items and medical equipment Entertainment, such as board games, movies, podcasts and books Extra blankets
