Let's Get Spiffy!

The Annual Spring Clean-up "Let's Get Spiffy" is set for **Friday, May 27 (from 10 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.) & Saturday, May 28, 2022 (from 9:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.)**

This is a service provided for Town residents so they may do a major clean-up of their properties and have disposal services available. The bins will be located at the Public Works yard at 5104-41 Street for people to drop off large items that would not normally be picked up on regular waste collection days. These items are:

Metals – stoves, refrigerators, other appliances.

Wood – including long tree branches, clean construction materials, etc.

NOTE: Residents will need to take WOOD to the Town's Lagoon Site.

Waste – mattresses, chairs and other large items

Electronics – T.V., microwaves, etc.

Wire – fencing, electrical wire, etc.

Hazardous Waste – paint, oil, lightbulbs, batteries

There is no charge for this service. This event is open to Town of Onoway residents only so residents must bring proof of residence - such as your tax roll number or utility bill.
