I hope this message finds you well!

First, I would like to congratulate our CAO Jennifer Thompson, once again, on her Long Service Recognition Service Award from Canadian Association of Municipal Administrators in recognition of her 20 years of commitment to public service and municipal management! CONGRATULATIONS!

Now for other news, Council has passed the Tax Rate Bylaws and administration has prepared and mailed out the tax notices on May 16, 2024. To avoid penalties, please remember the deadline to pay your property taxes is June 30, 2024.

The Town of Onoway is working with Canadian Fiber Optics (internet service provider) on the feasibility of installing fiber through the town. Council has passed a motion to negotiate a municipal access agreement with CFO. CFO has done a lot of installs with municipalities to the northwest and they are extremely happy with their service. I believe high speed internet is just around the corner for Onoway.

Also, for those that have not noticed yet, the LDS development has begun, and while they had to remove several mature trees to allow for the leveling of the property, they have assured us that new trees will be planted.

May 19-25 was Public Works Week. Our Onoway full time and summer employees play an essential role improving our quality of life. We greatly appreciate the substantial contributions that the Public Works crew make to protect our health and safety while focusing on improving our facilities, services and infrastructure.

And, last but not least, I am thankful that the earlier dry weather prediction has been wrong, and we have a summer with plenty of rain and minimal risk and wildfires. It is so nice to see the sun's true color.

Looking ahead into June, Onoway Heritage Days is being held June 14-16, 2024, and we hope to see you there enjoying the many activities they have in store. This year's theme is the "80's".

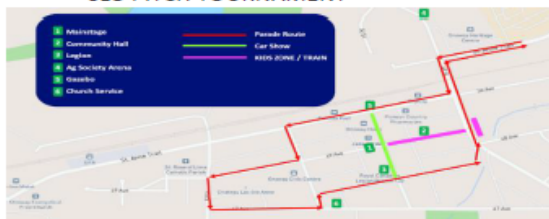
