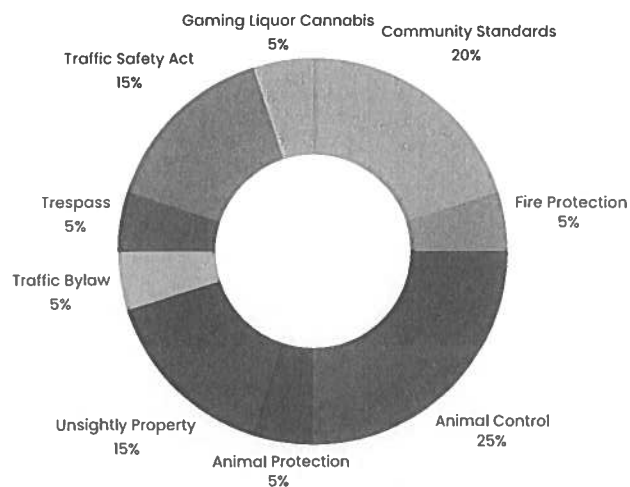

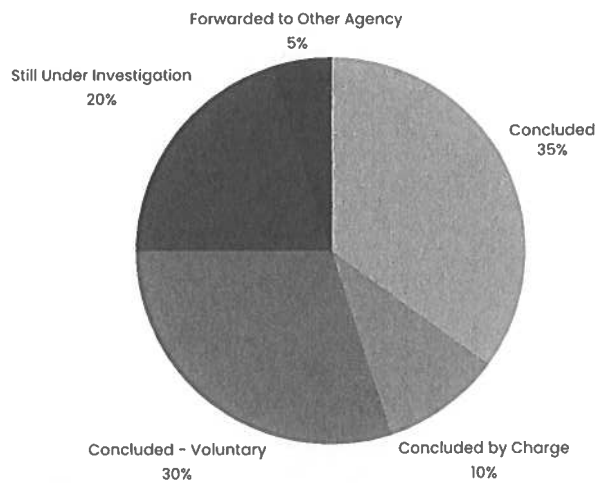
Enforcement Services has dealt with a total of 20 Incidents in Q3. You can find a breakdown of the categories below.

In addition to the 10 incidents there were also 11 calls that came in through the complaint line, these are calls that are able to be dealt with immediately and require no further action.

There were 3 orders issued in Q3 – 2 were unsightly properties and 1 was for the Community Standards Bylaw



## **Proactive Enforcement:**

- Officers had a focus on School Zones with the back-to-school season.
- There has still been an emphasis on unsightly properties and cleanup.
  - In September, Enforcement Services issued a 546 (Dangerous Property Enforcement Order) on a structure in Onoway that posed a danger to the public due to the state of the building. The building was successfully demolished, and the lot has been put to auction by the town for a higher sale price than it would have if the building was left. This encourages future development for the Town of Onoway
  - There is another large cleanup that is in progress with voluntary compliance - this will help ensure the value in the community is not degraded.
