Clean Up



Let's Get Spiffy!

The Annual Spring Clean-up "Let's Get Spiffy" is set for Friday, May 24, 2019 from 10 am to 7 pm & Saturday, May 25, 2019, 9 am to 7 pm. This is a service provided for Town residents so they may do a major clean-up of their properties and have disposal services available. The bins will be located at the Public Works yard at 5104-41 Street for people to drop off large items that would not normally be picked up on regular waste collection days. These items are:

Metals – stoves, refrigerators, other appliances.

Wood – including long tree branches, construction materials, etc.

NOTE: Residents will need to take WOOD to the Town's Lagoon Site.

Waste – mattresses, chairs and other large items.

Electronics – T.V., microwaves, etc.

Wire – fencing, electrical wire, etc.

There is no charge for this service. This event is open to Town of Onoway residents only so residents must bring proof of residence - such as your tax roll number or utility bill.

Organics Collection

Effective May 7, 2019, the organics collection service will resume. The cost for this service is included in the Garbage Flat Rate charge on your utility bill. Please use the large organics cart (with green lid) and set it out on Tuesdays, same day as the waste collection. Make sure to place your 2 carts about 4 – 6 feet apart at the curb and to remove the carts from the curb as soon as possible after collection. Vegetable & fruit waste, egg waste, coffee grinds, grass clippings, small branches, leaves, pruning's, garden foliage and weeds are acceptable organics cart items.

Remember – put your organic items directly into the cart – do NOT use any type of bag or container

Water Main Flushing

In the month of May Public works will be performing annual water main flushing. During this process you may notice a brief drop in pressure and there may be a discolouration of the water while they're working in your area. This is a result of the mineral build up on the inside of the pipe being freed by velocity. This is safe, however should you notice this please run your tap for a couple minutes to clear it out of your line.
